Protected natural areas include 72 Natural Reserves and 5 Regional Parks, to which the first Sicilian National Park of Pantelleria was added in 2016.

5. The Mediterranean climate

The less extensive of temperate climates, thanks to its mild winters, makes Sicily the perfect holiday destination, in every season of the year.

6. The sense of history and art

You can feel everywhere – in particular admiring the majesty of ancient temples and theatres, domes and cathedrals and, in general, the 111 cultural sites representing 26.4% of the national cultural heritage.

7. The colourful and noisy markets

Where you can buy natural and highquality raw materials, many of which are presents coming from some of the ancient populations dominating Sicily, as well as timeless recipes, handed down over the centuries from mother to daughter.
